





## **ABOUT PROJECT CHILDSAFE**

Project ChildSafe® is a nationwide education program that promotes responsible gun ownership and safe storage of firearms in the home. The program was developed by the National Shooting Sports Foundation (NSSF®), the trade association for the firearm industry, to raise awareness about firearm safety. Central to the program are the free cable-style gun locks and educational materials gun owners can use to securely store their guns away from unauthorized persons, including children, at-risk individuals and criminals.

Through vital partnerships with law enforcement, elected officials, community leaders, state agencies, the firearms industry, health care experts, the faith community and other stakeholders, Project ChildSafe® has helped raise awareness about the importance of storing firearms securely when not in use to help prevent accidents, theft and misuse, including suicide.

## **QUICK FACTS**

•	Since 2003, the program has distributed more than <b>40 million free firearm safety kits</b> , which include a cable-style gun lock with installment instructions and a gun safety booklet. (This is in addition to more than 70 million free firearm locks manufactures have provided with new gun purchases).
•	Project ChildSafe® has <b>partnered with thousands of law enforcement agencies</b> in communities across the country in all 50 states and five U.S. territories.
•	Project ChildSafe® has <b>more than 13,000 organizational supporters</b> , and works cooperatively with state fish and wildlife agencies across the U.S. to promote safe firearms handling and storage.
•	In the 20+ years since Project ChildSafe® launched, fatal firearms accidents have <b>dropped to historic lows</b> , according to data from the CDC and other authorities.
•	Every day, NSSF® receives <b>5–10 new requests for packages of hundreds of firearm safety kits</b> and educational materials from law enforcement agencies.
